"TUBERCULOUS ULCER GLANS PENIS-A CASE NOTE"

With Lupus Vulgaris

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Since our case note on Tuberculous ulcer glans penis (Ind. J. Derm. Vener. Oct-Dec. 1962) another case with lupus vulgaris reported for treatment.

JA, 30, MM, Worker in a cotton mills, married 8 years, 3 living children teetotaler came with a history of sore penis (4 months) associated with eruptions lower lip (6 weeks).

On examination : as above.

Histological Section:—Biopsy from Penile ulcer confirmed our diagnosis of Tubercular origin.

Chest X-Ray:—P. A. view—"Infiltration Rt. upper zone".

Urin:—No abnormality - culture - negative for Acid fast Bacilli STS (V. D. R. L.) - Reactive 1:32

Biopsy:—Donovan bodies not found.

E. S. R. (Westergren)—1st hour - 10 m. m. 2nd hour 24 m. m. mean average 11 m. m.

Pyelography:—(I. V.) - no abnormality detected.

Skin biopsy from lower lip.—"Structure suggestive of Lupus vulgaris".

The patient was given a routine course of Streptodihydrostreptomycin and INAH combination. Sore and "Lupus" healed. At present he is being followed-up by Chest Department and V. D. Out-door.
