Instructions for Preparation of Papers

All papers or case reports will be taken up together and only 10 minutes will be given for each,

- A. Omit historical background in case reports. Keep it minimum (not more than 20% of your allotted time) for original scientific work.
- B. Deliver 40-50 words to a minute, i. e. 750 words for a paper of 15 minutes.
- C. Do not bring more than 6-8 slides for a 15-minute paper. The slides should not be copied from type-script but from hand lettering. It should not contain more than 8-10 lines, otherwise it loses the meaning. Omit unnecessary details from slides. Concentrate on main points to be emphasized.

Number your slides and mark the upper right hand corner after inserting it in a projector. Paper shall not be taken up if the author is absent.
Instructions to Chairman for conduct of a Session.

1. President of the conference shall appoint chairman for each session with the help of the general secretary and chairman of scientific committee.
2. Control discussion to 5 minutes for each paper., and 1 minute for each speaker. Pass slips to those who want to discuss before the beginning of a paper and ask them to write their names and few points they wish to comment on. All questions may be answered together. Do not allow cross discussions.
3. No programme should be cancelled.
4. Request the help of a reporter to indicate time for each paper. Pass on slips for discussion and collect them.

Instructions To Discussers

1. Comment on the presentation first. You may bring in your general experience of a particular subject but avoid your experience on a case.
2. Restrict your comments on a few 'pearls' only.

Programme For Scientific Session

1. Total number of papers in scientific programme should not normally exceed, 25.
2. Each paper ought to be given 15 minutes for presentation and 5 minutes for discussion.
3. Teaching seminar should be introduced in each scientific meeting where a particular problem in its various facets could be presented by those involved in active work.

4. It is proposed to introduce Teaching Seminars in various sub-specialities of dermato-venereology such as on the following subjects :
- (a) Mycology.
 - (b) Histopathology which may be further sub-divided into different categories such as acute inflammatory responses, chronic granulomas, neoplasms, degenerations, collagen disorders, histochemically diagnosable conditions such as mucinosis, amyloidosis, colloidosis, lipoidosis, etc.
 - (c) Allergy,
 - (d) Physical therapeutic methods in dermatology (electrosurgery, photo therapy and radiation therapy, etc.)
 - (e) Diagnostic methods in venereology.
 - (f) Pathogenesis and practice of leprosy.

We should also organize teaching exhibits on subjects in which our members may be academically active, e. g., exhibits can be arranged on 'pigmentation' 'nail-biology' 'studies on bulla formation': These are some of the subjects picked up from publications in our journal. Those members who are in a position to organize exhibits may please get in touch with chairman of scientific committee to chalk out the details of the presentation.

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
