Dr. T. K. Mehta Honoured

At a meeting of the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Bombay held on Friday the 10th March 1972, at 3-00 p.m., Dr. Thakershi Khushaldas Mehta, F.C.P.S., D.V.D., has been elected as President of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Bombay from 1st April 1972, for the year ending 31st March 1973.

Dr. T. K. Mehta is the Honorary Professor of Skin and V.D. at the Topiwala National Medical College and Honorary Dermatologist and Venereologist of the Nair Hospital. Dr. T. K. Mehta, is the leading Skin and Venereal Diseases Specialist of the country having been Ex-President of Indian Association of Dermatologists and Venereologists, in the year 1968. He is Chief of the Skin and V.D. Department of Bombay Hospital, Bombay-1. He is an eminent educationist having published 22 articles in different Journals, and has been author of a book "Physical Physiological disorders of Skin", published by Indian Journal of Dermatology and Venereology. He is a member, Faculty of Medicine, University of Bombay, Member-Union Public Service Commission, Ministry of Health, New Delhi and Maharashtra Public Service Commission, Member - Advisory Board, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, Member - Selection Borad, Govt. of Rajasthan, Jaipur.

Besides being a medical educationist and academician Dr. T. K. Mehta is a leading Social Worker, having been President, Lakhtar Mitra Mandel, Member-Executive Committee, Modh Vanik Boarding, Dadar, President - Bombay Deaf Society, Bombay, Vice-President - Indian National Society for Deaf, Bombay and a Rotarian Member - Rotary Club of Bombay.

- 1. Through the courtesy of Dr. S. S. Misra a Founder Fellow of the Academy, Dr. Misra's Gold Medal will be awarded for the best unpublished work in any field of biomedicine by a YOUNG (below 40 years) biomedical scientist. Other selected scientists will be awarded certificate of merit.
- 2. Through the courtesy of Shriram Foundation, the Academy will award Sir Shriram Gold Medal for the best published paper during the preceding three years on any PARA-CLINICAL SUBJECT (Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology and Preventive & Social Medicine). The work should have been done in India by any biomedical SCIEN-TISTS OF ANY AGE.
- 3. Through the courtesy of Dr. R. M. Kasliwal a Founder Fellow of the Academy, Dr. Kasliwal Prize/Medal will be awarded to the best worker in the field of "Colon and its diseases". No restriction of age. The nominee will supply complete bibliography on this subject including work in India.

Conditions:

1. The scientist should not have received any prize for the same paper/s in the past.
