## Announcement of the Fourth All India Conference of Dermatologists and Venereologists

The Fourth All India Conference will be held in Bombay at the Sir Cowasji Jehangir Hall, on Friday the 23rd and Saturday the 24th February 1962. The Conference Committee approved of the following programme at a meeting held on 16th September 1961.

We are sending you the provisional programme herewith. The details of the programme will be sent to you at a later date.

1. Seminar on the pattern of Skin Diseases in India: - will include survey of the diagnosis register of any one year 1959 or 1960 from the different Departments in India. The diseases may be tabulated as under to achieve uniformity of information.

- 2. Seminar on Venereal Diseases in India will include (a) Pattern of V.D. in the last deacde if possible, otherwise records of 1959 or 1960, (b) Experiences on the diagnostic procedures on a large number of patients, (c) Therapeutic studies on a sizeable number of cases and (d) Epidemiologic studies and social hygiene.
- 3. Seminar on Mycology will include (a) Clinical types of Dermatomycosis. Tabulate the records of either 1959 or 1960 as T. capitis, Tinea corporis, T. cruris, T. corporis and cruris. T. generalised, T. pedis, T. versicolor, T. barbae, T. hands and palms, Deep mycosis,

Vulvo-vaginitis, Intertrigo, Onycho-mycosis, Paronychia and Moniliasis. (b) Mycologic studies and the nature of organism recovered, (c) Investigative and (d) Therapeutic studies on a sizeable number of cases.

- 4. Seminar on Dermato-Venereology Problems of the Armed Forces will include (a) The nature of Dermato-Venereology problems in the forces (b) Mass treatment or prophylactic procedures employed and their results (c) Long term results of treatment of cases such as Neuro-syphilis or cardio-syphilis.
- 5. **Seminar on Allergic Disorders** will include (a) The clinical types of allergy, (b) Investigative approaches and (c) Therapeutic Studies on a sizable number of cases.
- 6. **Seminar on Leprosy** will include Epidemiology, diagnostic procedures, and long term follow up of treated cases.
- 7. Seminar on the Formulations of the Requirements and Organistion of Speciality Departments.
  - 8. Papers on Other Subjects Not Covered by Seminars:

#### ACCOMMODATION:

It is proposed to accommedate the majority of delegates and their families in the M.L.A.'s Hostel, near Sachivalaya. This hostel is meant for the members of the Legislative Assembly and comfortably furnished with attached bath. It is situated within walking distance from the venue of the Conference, as well as the heart of the Fort area, and sea side—if scientific seminar proves too much! Accommodation will be arranged, if so desired by the delegates. The rooms in the M.L.A.'s hostel are fully furnished and have attached bath rooms. The charges are as under:

Single Room - Rs. 9.00 per day without food.

Double Rooms - Rs. 17.00 per day without food.

Please submit to the Chairman, Scientific Sub-Committee not later than 30th November 1961 the title of your paper along with a summary in ten lines in case you intend reading one in any of the above Seminars. The full paper should be received by 15th December 1961. A detailed Scientific Programme will appear in the Indian Journal of Dermatology and Venereology, published from 1. Nagindas Mansions, Opera House T.T., Bombay-4 in early January 1962.

The reservation for accommodation require firm booking by payment of the accommodation charges in advance. Please send the same together with your delegate fee of Rs. 20.00 to save office work and postage.

### Railway Concession:
