Even though there is ambiguity in certain questions and some incorrectness in answers; on the whole this is a useful book. The task of preparing 780 questions is a tremendous one. The authors should be commended for undertaking this work. Students of the speciality will find much to thank the author for.

With more careful use of words and close attention to details the book can be improved. Perhaps one can look forward to these improvements in a later edition of the book.

An unusual case of lupus vulgaris (Verrucosus) associated with pulmonary tuberculosis in a young man is presented. He had asymptomatic pulmonary tuberculosis and developed a cold abscess in the perineum, leading to two bilateral, symmetrical verrucosus plaques in the ischio-rectal areas. Chemotherapy gave excellent results.
