Rules and Regulations.

- 1. The annual prize will be Rs. 1,000/- in cash and it will be offered for a total number of 5 years. The amount will be made available by the Trust to the branches annually. If the response is encouraging, it may be possible for the trust to consider extending it beyond 5 years.
- 2. There will also be a medal each year to serve as a more permanent recognition and this will be in addition to the cash prize. The Trust will bear the cost of the medal.
- 3. The prize and medal will be open to medical graduates and allied scientists.
- 4. Only the Indian Nationals in India and abroad will be eligible for the purpose.
- 5. Original unpublished work on any aspect of Vitiligo will be considered for the contest.
- 6. The prize winning candidate will be required to present his paper at the annual conference of the All India Body. The incidental expenses will be borne by the Trust.
- 7. There will be a panel of Judges consisting of three medical men out of whom two will be nominated by the Western branch and one by the donor. Whenever necessary experts in specific fields may be requested to help the panel.
- 8. The paper will be copy right of the Journal of the Indian Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists and Leprologists.
- 9. The paper in triplicate should be submitted to the Secretary, Western India Branch, Indian Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists and Leprologists, c/o Dr. T. K. Mehta, 20, M.P. Marg, Bombay-400 004, latest by September end.
- 10. Necessary notice will be published in other medical journals.

Dr. G. KRISHNA PRASAD

On April 2, 1973 in the prime of his youth, Dr. G. K. Prasad died in the Burns Center, Victoria Hospital, Bangalore, as a result of perforation of a gastric ulcer, secondary to accidental burns, sustained while on a brief visit to his home at Bangalore.
