Practice of Dermatology: Behl, P. N., Thompson Press (India) Limited, Faridabad, Haryana, 4th Edition, 1976.

This book is interestingly written and offers a great deal of dermatologic information. This is a pleasant, small volume of 528 pages.

The clinical manifestations of most of the diseases, affecting the skin, are stated in a definitive manner. The differential diagnosis and treatment sections are practical. The book is not burdened with references and with long aetiological discussions.

This is a volume, that can be read quickly. I believe that the medical students, internees, residents and those in general practice will find this a very comfortable introduction to dermatology and the dermatologists may readily enjoy comparing their experience with that of the author.
