A 28-year-old male had progressive penile ulceration for 50 days. After protected intercourse with his wife, he noted pain followed by ulceration with difficulty during urination. On examination, a deep cleft separated the glans from the shaft of penis. A constricting band was found embedded at the most distal part of the cleavage [Figure. 1]. On attempting to remove the band, it was revealed to be the proximal rolled part of a condom which had burrowed into the coronal sulcus.

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
